1 Course Content

Geometry in the plane, geometry in space, the integral in n -space, the derivative in n -space, vectors, vector calculus.

2 Course Policies

3 Grading

3.1 Quizzes (100 points)

There will be a 10 point quiz every Friday unless there is a scheduled test. I will take your 10 best quiz scores. There are no make-ups for quizzes.

3.2 Tests (400 points)

There will be 3 in-class tests and one departmental final examination. The tests will occur on the following dates:

Thus there is a total of 500 points.
